PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As our 2024 winter season draws to a close it is important to consider all that has been achieved over the past twelve months.

The most significant achievement is the commencement of the new PNA Umpire Development Pathway Program. Narelle Moore, Tania Giles and Libby Fulham worked over the summer break to design the new program. Unfortunately, this process did take us some time so our first year of implementation was a challenge for everyone. We established a Green Shirt Program coordinated by Sarah Curnow, a Cadet Umpire Program for C Badged umpires coordinated by Lauren Taylor and an Academy Umpire program for high calibre C badged umpires looking to become B Badged and B badged umpires (previously PNA Squad). The Academy program and the entire umpiring Program is ably coordinated by Libby Fulham. Each of these programs were supported by our new PNA Umpire Program Administrator Michelle Patterson. I would like to thank all these people for the tremendous effort they have put in to ensure the success of this new program. Whilst we know there is plenty of room for improvement and expect we will have another year or two of development, it is very pleasing to see and hear all the positive feedback overall.

Unfortunately, Sarah Curnow is unable to continue as coordinator for the Green Shirt Program, however I am very pleased to announce that Vikki McPherson and Ashley Everett have agreed to coordinate this program jointly.

Over the next few months, we will consider all the feedback we have received with a view to advising of any changes to the PNA Umpire Development Pathway Program by the end of the year. I would like to thank all our clubs for their patience and cooperation as we work towards developing a successful and sustainable PNA Umpire Development Pathway Program.

Continuing with our focus on umpiring in 2024 we introduced a yellow spectator line around all courts to ensure clear access for all umpires. Whilst this does reduce the amount of space available for spectators it was necessary to ensure the safety of all our umpires. Once again feedback has been very positive and not just from umpires.

This year also saw new rules and clarification of existing rules implemented by World Netball. We have seen the use of rolling substitutions across the entire competition plus quite a significant change to game management rules across the board. Understandably the bedding down of these new rules and more clarification of existing rules will take time. PNA will continue to offer additional training next year on the application of these new features.



One of our major issues at PNA is parking. Friday nights NetSetGo was of serious concern with many younger players and more spectator cars attending. To help alleviate the situation we introduced NetSetGo on Thursday evenings this year. Whilst we only had 33 teams at 4:10pm, feedback has been very positive, and we look to increase the number of NetSetGo teams participating on Thursdays in the future.

It was hoped that we would have all our courts under lights for this winter season however due to circumstances outside our control this has not been achievable. The project to install lights on the remaining 12 courts is now underway and should be completed by the end of the year. This will enable us to increase our Thursday night NetSetGo competition and the number of courts available for evening use.

PNA had another very successful weekend at the Fuel to Go and Play Association Championships this year. Out of 19 teams, 14 teams finished within the top four and 7 teams won their division. Thank you to all the players, coaches, umpires, team managers and staff for their magnificent effort and dedication. The weekend was unfortunately bittersweet as Liz Booth, one of netball's icons, passed away on Saturday 1 June 2024. Liz's commitment to netball and especially the Association Championships knew no bounds.

It was with sadness that in July this year we said farewell to Troy Starcevich, our Executive Officer for more than 8 years. Troy brought a sense of calm and order to a very hectic organisation. We are very fortunate to have Tibbie Galbraith now take on the role of Executive Officer. Tibbie brings a wealth of knowledge in the netball arena to this role. We are all very excited to work with Tibbie as Executive Officer.

With Tibbie taking on this new role, our Competitions Coordinator Kalyssa Rasmussen moved into the Development role, and we welcomed back Hannah Boyd as Competition Coordinator. Together with Heather Felton our Finance Officer, Michelle Patterson our Umpiring Administrator, Leanne Christensen our Canteen Manager the PNA staff continue to deliver the best standard of service to all our members. Sadly, Anita Kent our Administrator has recently resigned, so we will be recruiting a new person for this role in due course.

It is a fulfilling but often challenging environment to work in at PNA. I want to acknowledge and sincerely thank our highly dedicated staff for all the time and effort they put in during the year. I would also like to thank all the members of our PNA Executive who work tirelessly behind the scenes supporting PNA plus contribute many hours to their own Clubs. Furthermore, without all our Club Coordinators, Club Committee members, Club volunteers, life members and members, PNA would not be able to continue to grow and strengthen.

As the winter season ends, PNA are excited and looking forward to the upcoming Spring season that expands beyond the Winter Season competition age groups and includes Year 9-12 Mixed Teams as well as Walking Netball.

Thank you to everyone involved for helping to make PNA one of the biggest and best there is.

PNA ACADEMY

The PNA Academy Program aims to bridge the gap between Association and WANL. We are excited to expand our PNA Academy program and continue to offer our athletes and coaches exposure to the elite Netball environment.

Only athletes identified by PNA, and their clubs were invited to trial (with the exception of those in the 20s and Under age group, who may self-nominate). Teams were selected from athletes in the following age groups: 12s, 14 & Under, 16 & Under, and 20 & Under. Athletes will participate in an 8-week intensive training program focusing on both on and off court skills, and a 6 week Friday night competition against other Metro Associations played at rotating venues. This includes Wanneroo Districts Netball Association, Fremantle Netball Association and Southern Districts Netball Association. The competition will be run during Spring commencing on Friday 18th October 2024.

ASSOCIATION UMPIRE DEVELOPMENT OFFICER'S REPORT

This year marks a significant development in the umpiring program at PNA, with a change in the umpiring structure and the implementation of new development pathways. The most significant achievements of 2024 are outlined below.

PNA Umpire Structure

The new umpire structure includes three development programs, Green Shirt, Cadets and Academy. Each program has an allocated co-ordinator and includes administrative support.

Umpiring Committee

The 2024 umpiring committee has been instrumental in the development and implementation of the new umpire structure. The committee has formulated the new structure and has been monitoring the implementation and has been evaluating its effectiveness.

The 2024 Committee consists of Libby Fulham (AUDO), Narelle Moore, Tania Giles, Fran Farrington (President), and the Executive Officer (Tibbie Galbraith). The program co-ordinators (Lauren Taylor and Sarah Curnow) also participate by informing the committee of the progress of the programs.

PNA Umpire Academy

Co-ordinator: Libby Fulham

The PNA Academy provides the pool of umpires allocated to Open 1 and Year 9-12 Division 1 matches. These umpires also provide coaching and mentoring to Academy and Cadets umpires and support the AUDO with other umpire development programs. In total there were 29 Academy umpires in 2024.

PNA Umpire Cadets

Co-ordinator: Lauren Taylor

The Cadet program participants were selected from the pre-season PiPP trials. In total, there were 17 Cadet umpires in 2024. The purpose of Cadets is to retain and provide support to newly and up-coming C badged umpires who demonstrate a desire to progress along the Netball Australia umpire pathway. The PNA Cadets provides the pool of umpires allocated to year 7/8 Division 1 and 9-12 Division 8 matches. They may also assist the AUDO to coach new umpires and Green Shirt umpires at the Association.

PNA Green Shirt program

Co-ordinator: Sarah Curnow

The one-year Green Shirt umpiring program is a practical umpiring course aimed at developing and training beginner umpires, of all ages, to ultimately attain their National C badge. This program also aims to increase the number of umpires and assists in the difficult early development of umpires. It also aims to create and develop the supportive culture required to make umpiring a valued and attractive pathway to engagement and participation in netball.

This year 60 Green Shirt umpires were selected from the April school-holiday clinic. This is likely to change in 2025 to broaden the selection process and commence the development program prior to the commencement of the winter competition. There were 19 Green Shirt mentors, from the Cadet program and clubs.

During Spring 2023, a Green Shirt program was run with beginner umpires chosen from our school holiday workshops. These umpires were allocated mostly to the Year 6 competition with some on Year 5 games.

School Holiday Umpire Workshops

Three workshops were held in the April and July school holidays with a fourth to be held in the upcoming October school holidays.

These workshops are facilitated by our experienced umpires and put new umpires through the theory component of the Green Shirt program. Practical experience is also gained by umpiring games that are part of the player school holiday clinics.

New Rules/Education Sessions

World Netball released the 2024 Rules of Netball, which came into play from January 1, 2024.

Along with adaptations to existing rules, particularly clarifications and streamlining of contact and advantage, the 2024 edition focuses on player safety and game management. The layout of the Rules has also been updated to simplify and encourage use by all of the Netball Family, not just umpires.

PNA Club Umpire Grants Program

This year was the fourth year that PNA has offered our club umpire grants program. The aim of the program is to increase the number of umpires at the association who receive coaching. The program also aims to provide training to club umpire coaches to ensure a level of consistency across clubs.

Fifteen clubs took part in the umpire grant program, nine of which used 100% of their funds. \$9860 was paid out to the clubs. 1156 reports were submitted, and 261 different umpires were coached. 24 of the 39 umpires who were awarded a C-Badge this year, were coached in the program.

Badging

Thirty-nine C Badges and one B Badge were awarded this year. A full list of badged umpires for 2024 is included in Appendix 3.
